Step 11 is not only a maintenance step, but a step rooted in growth. By practicing it daily, we allow ourselves to become more connected to our Higher Power, and in turn becoming more in tune with His plan for our lives. Having thoroughly practiced each of the preceding steps, we now begin to grow in our spirituality.

For many of us, prayer and meditation are not things we actively utilized in our days of active addiction outside of the occasional "foxhole" prayers. You know the ones: "God, if you get me out of this situation, I will never do this again," or "God, if you can just get me past this hangover, I will never drink again." For most of us, these prayers never held any real meaning. If we were lucky enough to get through the aforementioned situation, there was no time before we found ourselves right back in the same position. For those of us who never utilized prayer in our daily lives, we were left wondering at this point how to genuinely pray, and our literature provides us with an 11th step prayer to get us started.

"Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace! That where there is hatred, I may bring love. That where there is wrong, I may bring the spirit of forgiveness. That where there is discord, I may bring harmony. That where there is error, I may bring truth. That where there is doubt, I may bring faith. That where there is despair, I may bring hope. That where there are shadows, I may bring light. That where there is sadness, I may bring joy. Lord, grant that I may seek rather to comfort, that to be comforted. To Understand, than to be understood. To love, than to be loved. For it is by self-forgetting that one finds. It is by forgiving that one is forgiven. It is by dying that one awakens to eternal life. Amen."

This prayer acts as a great guideline for how we can begin to strengthen our contact with our Higher Power. No matter who or what we have decided our Higher Power to be, the prayer suggests we desire to know how we can be of better service to our fellows. This prayer asks we be shown how we to make a difference in the world; a world that, during our active addiction, many of us rarely gave a passing thought. We are asking for guidance to step out of ourselves and be there for others.

At this stage in our recovery, we find ourselves no longer seeking the answers to selfish questions. Questions like, "how can I get (insert thing here) to make myself feel better" start to diminish. Now we ask what we can do to make the lives of those around us better as a service to our fellows. As we begin to fortify contact with our Higher Power, our true selves are slowly revealed. What we really have is a daily reprieve contingent on the maintenance of our spiritual condition. Every day is a day when we must carry the vision of God's will into all of our activities. "How can I best serve Thee - Thy will (not mine) be done."



What is your sobriety date? May 16th, 1977

What is your homegroup? When/where does it meet?

Keep It Simple group, Tues morn 10AM @ Faith Baptist Church, 660 Holmes Ave, Lake Placid Fl. My wife Linda and I started this group 5 yrs ago and I'm still making coffee! (I'm a tea drinker).

Do you currently hold any service positions?

Since I moved to Fla in 2014, I've been involved in jail/prison meetings for Highlands County and Avon Park State Correction facility. I highly recommend this to anyone who thinks their life has little or no meaning! This will give you a purpose real quick.

Did you ever relapse? What happened? What has changed?

Thankfully, I have never relapsed. I was taught early on that relapse is NOT a requirement for recovery and faith in a Higher Power and a program of action will prevent this unnecessary stumble.

What is the most important lesson you have learned in sobriety?

Impossible to say what is the most important lesson, but there are a few important things: You don't have to do this alone-and you shouldn't!! An alcoholic in his own mind is in terrible company! The 12 steps are the program of recovery, the fellowship of AA is one of the best ways to see the program in action.

What is your favorite line /phrase from the Big Book?

My favorite part of the Big Book is the end of Dr.Bob's Nightmare, pg. 181, last big paragraph. Read it !!

What is the best piece of advice you received from a "long-timer?'

Best suggestion from a long-timer... When you're in the middle of a mess and you don't know what to do, go help someone else, God will see you through.

What is the best thing you've ever heard in a meeting?

Impossible to identify the best thing i ever heard in a meeting. As we get older, you forget things easier and more often. That's why I keep going to meetings.

What step was the hardest for you? Why?

As I was going through the steps in early sobriety, 4 was scary for awhile, 5 was somewhat fearful based on some old religious misbelief and it took a bit for the simplicity of 6 &7 to take root in my recovery.

What tradition means the most to you?


Tradition 10 is real important and it seems to have been dismissed summarily with the absurd change in the AA Preamble.

What would your sponsor say about you?

Not sure what my sponsor would say about me, and I don't find it necessary to ask him. We enjoy our individual and collective sobriety and I value his experience and his bold and sarcastic Irish sense of humor.

What advice would you give to a newcomer?

I don't give advice to folks unless I'm asked; I used to get terrible advice in bars. I ask for and give experience, for that is what I know. To any newcomer, I suggest they give themselves a chance at a much better life than the reasons that brought them into AA in the first place. I'd also remind them that after spending more than 20 minutes in an AA meeting that their drinking is ruined now anyway! If they are alcoholic, they might as well stay and learn more about the boundless benefits of sober living.
