# Step 7 -Humility

When working on the 7th step, the idea of humility comes down to having a realistic perspective of oneself. Humility is being honest about one's life and place in the world. This is the art of being "right-sized." When a person apologetically asks their Higher Power to remove their shortcomings, they recognize that they are

neither too great or too small. Ego, self-entitlement, shame, and regrets are all gone. By admitting one's powerlessness over alcohol, one has already begun embracing humility. During this step, recovering alcoholics often realize that humility is not a state of despair, but rather a state of serenity and acceptance of life, despite whatever comes to pass. It is a continuing opportunity for a person to welcome humility

as a central element of remaining sober.



Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it's thinking of yourself less. -C. S. Lewis



Taking Step Seven was for many of us the greatest act of authentic humility we have ever been asked to commit: to transfer control of our recovery to God.

According to the Twelve and Twelve, humility is a clear recognition of who we are followed by a sincere attempt to become what we could be. That is, humility is seeing ourselves as we actually are, good and bad, strong and weak, and acting authentically on those truths. This is not a naïve attitude suggesting we have in some way already "arrived." It is a sincere attempt to state the positive truth that when we face the truth of our shortcomings and the fact that we are powerless to change and begin to let God take our defects away, we have entered the pathway of humility. For the reality is, only God can take away our deeply entrenched addictions, and our lifelong character defects. It is on this pathway, where we humbly ask God to remove all these defects of character, that the tools of recovery bring the healing, happiness, and security we have dreamed of. But once more it is only powerlessness and pain that can force us to take the 7th Step into humility.



On his desk, Dr. Bob had a plaque defining humility:

"Perpetual quietness of heart. It is to have no trouble. It is never to be fretted or vexed, irritable or sore; to wonder at nothing that is done to me, to feel nothing done against me. It is to be at rest when nobody praises me, and when I am blamed or despised, it is to have a blessed home in myself where I can go in and shut the door and kneel to my Father in secret and be at peace, as in a sea of calmness, when all around and about is seeming trouble."

Miracles and Gifts of Sobriet

Right after graduation from nursing school my alcohol career began. Prior to the alcohol I had abused other drugs but when alcohol came into my life it was like I had finally found the elixir of the Gods. The alcohol actually eased physical pain that I had been experiencing for several years as a result of a major surgery. Alcohol also eased my mental and spiritual pain. Alcohol was my best friend and savior. It did not take long before the problems began. Deep down in my soul I felt things were not right, and booze was causing more pain than pleasure. Alcohol had become my worst enemy bringing along with it all the demons that alcoholism brings.

Thanks to a judge that was tired of seeing me in his courtroom from drunk and something else. Drunk and fighting, drunk and driving, drunk and etcetera. I was ordered to attend AA meetings which I thought was cruel and unusual punishment. My AA journey began April 19th, 1971 in Ohio when I slunk into my first AA meeting. Much of the meeting was hazy due to all the pills I fortified myself with. People hugged each other, they said keep coming back, and this was something I had not heard in a long time. It was more like, get out and don't come back we don't want your kind here. Then they prayed and held each other's hands. I sure was not going to pray and certainly did not want to hold hands with strangers. Needless to say, my life was a mess. I only came to AA to find a way to drink and not get into trouble. It would be thirteen more miserable years of suffering, jails and mental hospitals before I was tired of all this fun that was killing me. During those 13 years, I sporadically would attend AA meetings. I heard words like honesty, and I knew nothing of being honest. All I knew about was lying, cheating, and stealing. Judging others and taking their inventories was really easy. Reading the Big Book and those steps were good for those other people, but I was not as bad as them and I did not need them. Thank you, but no thanks. A sponsor was out of the question. I knew what those women in the meetings were there for. The only thing that I did for those years was, I kept sporadically back to meetings. I somehow could put together, some sober (white-knuckle) time and pick up a chip. I picked up my first 1-year chip in 1976, my second 1-year chip in 1980 and my final 1-year (real) sobriety chip in 1985. I was a slow learner. Sometime in the early part of February 1984, after being sick and tired of being sick and tired, I surrendered to a God I didn't believe in with a simple prayer: "if you are up there and can hear me, could you please help me?" A few days later, I took my final drink of alcohol. That was February 7th, 1984. Since that day, it has not been necessary to take another drink of alcohol nor anything else to ease my physical, mental, or spiritual pain. I am not the same person I was. My attitude and outlook on life have changed completely. Today, I am able to believe in a Creator who has created us all. This in itself is a great miracle coming from a self-proclaimed atheist or at least an agnostic when I got to this miracle making program. I feel happy joyous and free today. It is all due to the Creator and AA and to my daily reprieve from alcohol. Now dependence is on the 12 steps, 12 traditions, and 12 concepts for my recovery. I can honestly say that I am grateful to be a recovering alcoholic and part of a fellowship that is not a place of judgement, but of place of acceptance and love. I became active in service work in my district, began attending the area assemblies in July 1985, and currently have the privilege as serving as Intergroup Chair. I have been given the gift of sponsorship. Such a joy. I have gone from looking in the mirror and seeing and hearing the "committee" looking back at me and talking about the hell that was going to happen. Gradually, I found a God of my understanding whom I call Creator. Thanks to The Creator for The AA program and the peace of mind today. I place The Creator first instead of myself, and being of service to others. These are the miracles and gifts of Alcoholics Anonymous. It doesn't matter when or how we got here or anything else, we are all miracles. We have been given a gift. A gift not to be taken lightly. A gift that must be passed on. I am now 37 years happy, joyous, and free. Thank to AA, The Creator and service work.
