So what is Step Nine of AA Alcoholics Anonymous? Step Nine is that biggie step, the one we likely have created some anxiety over because it involves making amends. It is suggested that we make direct amends to people whenever possible. What does that mean?

There are three kinds of amends:

Direct Amends – taking personal responsibility for your actions and confronting the person who you would like to reconcile with.

Indirect Amends – finding ways to repair damage that cannot be reversed or undone by doing things like volunteering and helping others.

Living Amends – when you show others as well as yourself that you have made a genuine lifestyle change and are making a commitment to yourself and those that you have hurt that you will & have discarded your previous destructive behaviors.

We have already begun making amends to ourselves by changing some of our behaviors, attitudes and beliefs. The part of the amends process whereby we change ourselves has an effect on everyone around us and goes on long after we've spoken directly to someone we have harmed. When it comes to making amends to others, there are usually a lot of fears and expectations involved. We may be afraid about making financial amends, or afraid of rejection, retaliation and a host of other doubtful outcomes. However, making amends doesn't always have to be a nerveracking, dreadful or joyless experience. In fact, maybe you'll find that you feel excited about the possibility of healing a relationship or happily anticipating the relief you will feel after having made a particularly scary amends or even paying off a debt. There is freedom that is gained by cleaning up the past, a freedom to live peacefully in the present.

To keep things as simple as possible, you can get your head in the game by focusing on the purpose of the Ninth Step. Keep in mind the three concepts or "The Three R's" of the Ninth Step that are associated with making amends:

Restoration, Resolution and Restitution.

Restoration means bringing something back to its former state, usually things that have been damaged. This can mean restoring our reputations, and even restoring trust in a relationship.

Resolution as recovering addicts, means we likely have past experiences that plague us or disturb us in some way. Finding a resolution to these problems means coming up with answers and solutions and laying them to rest.

Restitution as it relates to the Ninth Step is the act of returning something material (or abstract) to its rightful owner.

Our sponsors can help us explore each of these concepts so that we gain perspective on the nature of our specific amends and stay focused on what we're supposed to be doing. The key is that we keep the focus on ourselves and our "side of the street," so to speak.

Even though we may be eager to rip the Band-Aid off and get an amend over and done with, it's important that we are not impulsive or careless as we attempt to make amends! Some thought and planning needs to go into it for the best possible outcome. On the flipside of the same AA coin, it is equally important that you don't procrastinate making amends. Why? Because, based on experience, many recovering individuals have relapsed when they allowed their fears to keep them from doing Step Nine. Dr. Bob, one of our original founders could not stay sober until he went around town and made amends to all those he had hurt. (jasonwahler.com)

What is your sobriety date? *June 26, 1988*

What is your homegroup? When/where does it meet?

Busters for Sobriety at Callahan's - Callahan's Restaurant in Destin - 7 days a week at 8:00am

Do you currently hold any service positions?

Not currently - I do chair my home group every 2 or 3 months, and try to take a coffee commitment as well.

Did you ever relapse? What happened? What has changed?

No - I did what I think of as "drive by AA" from 1983 to 1988 (going to treatment to get out of trouble, etc) but never participated in recovery - so I don't consider relapses to be part of the story, because there was never any recovery to begin with. I don't think you can relapse from something you never had in the first place. I never expected to see age 30 - at 29 1/2 I realized I probably wasn't going to die any time soon - and living another 40 or 50 years the way I had been living scared me. I realized that whatever the AA people were doing was working, and "AA as modified by Beth" was not - so on June 26, 1988 I made a conscious decision to try doing EVERYTHING that AA suggested - I have been sober ever since.

What is the most important lesson you have learned in sobriety?

To "be where my hands are" - God is in the present - if I am in worry (fear about the future) or remorse (guilt about the past) I am not in the present - I can't be in two places at once - the book says it best - we have to be careful not to drift into remorse or worry, or we squander time that might otherwise have been worthwhile. I try to carry the sense of God's presence with me always.

What is your favorite line /phrase from the Big Book?

One of the promises after Step 5: We can be alone at perfect peace and ease - I was never able to do that before I got sober.

What is the best piece of advice you received from a "long-timer?"

I was wrestling with a decision in early sobriety - my great-grandsponsor asked me "do you need to know right now?" - "if not, why don't you keep doing what you're doing, and see what it looks like when you get there" - that was a completely foreign idea to me - it changed the way I looked at things - it's really another way to say "be where your hands are"!

What is the best thing you've ever heard in a meeting?

Too many to count - I got sober in a meeting that read a whole chapter of the Big Book every day - preface/forwards one day, the Doctors Opinion the next, Chapters 1 thru 11, then start over - so I HEARD the first 164 pages of the book every 13 days - and was surrounded by people who read it and did what it said. I DO have one favorite quote though - Scott R used to say "I have to remind myself that most of my problem areas WEREN'T EVEN AREAS when I got sober!!"

What step was the hardest for you? Why?

Probably steps 6 and 7 - I heard an old timer say "character defects never go away, they just go off stage and change costumes!" - I have found that to be true! And Harry Tiebout said "never underestimate the power of the ego to regenerate itself" - which tells me that steps 6 and 7 are a lifetime process.

What tradition means the most to you?

Tradition 12 - the long form says "And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all." That tells me to stay grateful and remember that the messenger can never be more important than the message.

What would your sponsor say about you?

I have a home group, a job in my home group, and a sponsor - and I sponsor other women. That is what my sponsor refers to as "an AA member in good standing" - high praise indeed!
What advice would you give to a newcomer?

What advice would you give to a newcomer?

Don't just attend meetings, get a sponsor and work the steps! You can starve to death in a kitchen while studying a cookbook.... there are actions we MUST take. And... don't keep coming back - just STAY! It is way easier to stay than it is to come back.




