# "Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others."

"The readiness to take the full consequences of our past acts, and to take responsibility for the well-being of others at the same time, is the very spirit of Step Nine."

– Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, p. 83

At this point in our step work we may be trudging the road to happy destiny, but we've reached the point where we must repair what we left behind us on a path of shattered relationships. Step Nine of AA Alcoholics Anonymous is the perfect time to let go of the horrible way we feel about our past and to radically repair relationships. Walking around with the weight of amends that need to be taken care of really sucks. More importantly, living with the left over guilt and shame from past wrongdoings prevents us from moving forward and puts us at risk for drinking again.

#### Three kinds of amends:

**Direct Amends** – taking personal responsibility for your actions and confronting the person who you would like to reconcile with.

**Indirect Amends** – finding ways to repair damage that cannot be reversed or undone by doing things like volunteering and helping others.

**Living Amends** – when you show others as well as yourself that you have made a genuine lifestyle change and are making a commitment to yourself and those that you have hurt that you will & have discarded your previous destructive behaviors.

#### Restoration, Resolution and Restitution.

**Restoration** means bringing something back to its former state, usually things that have been damaged. This can mean restoring our reputations, and even restoring trust in a relationship. **Resolution** as recovering alcoholics, means we likely have past experiences that plague us or disturb us in some way. Finding a resolution to these problems means coming up with answers and solutions and laying them to rest.

**Restitution** as it relates to the Ninth Step is the act of returning something material (or abstract) to its rightful owner. ~jasonwahler.com




