STEP TWO OF AA: A POWER GREATER THAN OURSELVES

All of the words of the 12 steps are very specifically chosen, which is another thing I really love about working with them. The second step doesn't say "We came to believe in a power greater than ourselves" it says "We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity." That's the beauty-we are invited to begin to think about what our higher power can be.

The emphasis is not on who or what the power is, but on what the power can do for us. The group of AA itself certainly qualifies as a power greater than ourselves (our fellowship is in the millions and always growing) as do the spiritual principles contained in the 12 steps.

The awareness and understanding that we can't recover alone and that we need some kind of help is really the lesson at this point in recovery. The spiritual principles that are the foundation of this step are open mindedness, willingness, faith, trust and humility. It really doesn't matter whether we have any idea of how this power greater than ourselves is going to help, just that we come to believe it is possible.

As part of a recovery process it's really helpful to ask and answer important questions pertaining to step two; questions about insanity coming to believe, a power greater than ourselves, restoration to sanity and spiritual principles:

- Did you make insane decisions as a result of your alcoholism?
- Do you have any fears about coming to believe in something greater than yourself?
- What does "we came to believe" mean to you?
- What experiences have you heard other recovering alcoholics share about their process of coming to believe and have you tried any of them in your recovery/life?
- Do you have a problem accepting that there is a power/powers greater than yourself?
- What evidence do you have a "higher power" is working in your life?
- What are some of the things you consider good examples of sanity?
- What changes in your thinking and behavior are necessary for your restoration to sanity?
- Why is having a closed mind harmful to your personal recovery?
- How are you demonstrating open-mindedness in your life right now?
- What fears do you have that are getting in the way of your trust?
- What do you need to do to help let go of the fears?
- Are you seeking help from your sponsor, going to meetings and reaching out to other recovering alcoholics? If so what are the results?

I don't have to be in charge of everything and everyone. I don't have to defend myself to anyone, and I get to let others have their own ideas and principles while still respecting, loving and accepting them. My friends and family get to be true to themselves without judgement from me because my HP "God" wants me to see them as He does and that is as Divine and exactly where they are supposed to be right now. I wanted to share this to say that if you work the steps in order then Step 2 becomes simple to achieve.

For me, going to meetings, working the steps and getting a sponsor was necessary to staying sober. I have surrounded myself with people in this program that are working their sobriety and have shown me the way. If anyone out there is questioning the steps or needs guidance I suggest you do the same. Find someone who has what you want and ask them how they did it. If they truly are doing the deal they will freely give to you what they have. I hope to see you all as we trudge this road to happy destiny.

As Tradition One states, "Our Common Welfare should come first, personal recovery depends on A.A. unity." The pathway to unity can be found in your home group. Then participate in that group's activities including the business meetings (Don't roll your eyes). Participation in a home group was the first step in expanding my A.A. program. This is how you get to inform the group conscience of the General Service Conference (GSC) in New York. Your General Service Representative (GSR) will receive information on the agenda items assigned to your group. You will be given the opportunity to provide feedback to your GSR on those items and your voice will be carried to the Area 1 Assembly through your GSR & DCM. Our Area 1 Delegate (Tomy G.) will then use your feedback on these important issues to help guide his votes at the General Service Conference.

Remember the GSC was created by Bill W. as a means for AA members to "assume direct responsibility for the guardianship of A.A. tradition and the directions of our principal service affairs."¹ In A.A. it is the groups who have the ultimate authority and responsibility for world services.² In a sense the GSC is the ultimate group conscience. There will be Workshops and more information on this process made available to you as soon as it is available to us.

Plain Language Big Book. One recent agenda item for the GSC concerned the Plain Language Big Book. This topic has spawned much debate within A.A. An excellent information session on this topic will be presented by our Southeast Regional Delegates on February 25, 2024, from 2:00-4:00 PM EST (1:00-3:00 PM CST) Zoom ID: 867 2200 6265, PW: 924686. 
